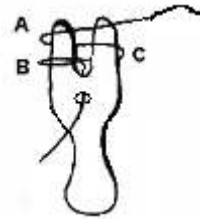


How to use a Lucet

Lucets can be made of any hard material such as bone horn or wood. The Lucet style of weaving creates a cord of square proportions. One can keep knotting (weaving) the threads almost indefinitely. The cord made is surprisingly strong. Depending on the thickness of the thread, everything from delicate cording for garments to a thin rope can be made. However, this method of knotting does not make the cord elastic in any way



1. Thread the Lucet by forming a figure 8



2. Flip the Lucet over from right to left
3. Lift thread A over B, holding tail of thread (string or yarn) firmly against Lucet
4. Pull to tighten knot against right prong then center

5. Repeat steps 2, 3,& 4 till desired length has be reached while allowing the tail (corded knot) to slip through the hole. Pull end of C occasionaly to keep cord taut and square

This method works for handled and handless Lucets and for right or left handed people.
